Packed full of cricket

So, May's over and despite the rain washing out six games we've still played fourteen senior games of cricket in the month. A tremendous effort for a small club, especially when you add the fifteen colts section games too.

As a senior unit we twice fielded three sides on a Saturday for the first time in several years, and whilst there are challenges in fielding 33 players, it was achieved and a really big well done should go to Lyndon Price and Jim Keys for getting the final 11 out.

After a slow start to the season in April all three Saturday teams and the Sunday 1st XI have all got wins under their belts.

There has already been six five wicket hauls or better and it's only June. Last year we only managed 10 in the whole season so it looks as though it may be a vintage year for the bowlers.

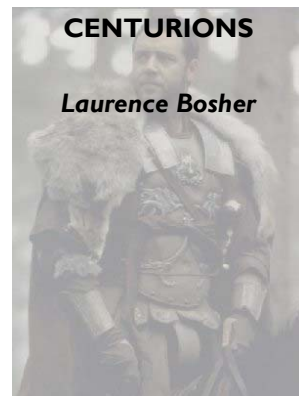
