## Eighty Years Ago...

Gillett joined Keys and they were not put off by Ellerbeck twirling his bat on the boundary edge for several overs as they put the final 30 on the board.

It was the third victory on the trot after the opening day defeat and Waresley II's are top of the table (albeit having played an extra game).

Gillett (2-39) and Collings (4-29) both returned for their second spells, and with Hussain last man out to a well judged catch by Ben Evans on the boundary the innings closed with the score on 132.

After a splendid tea from Mrs Donald, Waresley's opening pair of Donald and Collings set about chasing down the oppositions total, but with the wicket still offering plenty of assistance to the bowlers it was slow progress with only 20 coming of the first 10 overs. Having weathered the
