## 25 Years Ago - The Gifford Cup Win 1983

Twenty five years ago this month, Waresley reached their first Gifford Cup final when they played the mighty Huntingdon side at Ramsey. At the time, Huntingdon were flying high in the Beach Villas League, the highest league in the area at the time while Waresley, still in the Millman Trophy League, were enjoying their first season under 23 year old skipper, Kevin Cole.

The Hunts Post reported - "Underdogs Waresley turned the form book upside down to win the Gifford Cup for the first time in the club's history. The unfancied village side beat favourites Huntingdon by 18 runs for a memorable victory. Until this season Waresley had never been beyond the first round. But on their way to the final, they had dumped St Ives, St Neots & Ramsey out of the competition. And the cricket minnows won the cup in style – establishing a record total of 171. Champagne corks were popping after the match and players and officials were toasting 16 year-old opener Nick Adams who smashed the



Huntingdon bowlers all over the ground. Nick scored 72 in only 43 balls, putting on 52 for the first wicket with skipper Kevin

seen at Huntingdon for several years. Miles was unlucky to be caught one short of his half century, but Philip Gillett added

Cole, and adding 47 with David Miles. His run out brought an end one of the finest innings

another 30 priceless runs. The Huntingdon reply started well but then opener Martin Stephen-

son (24) & Trevor Reed (17) were both run out. Mike Ringrose went on to complete his 50 but when he & Butch Harris (32) were bowled, Waresley sensed a shock victory was on the cards. Young Adams, a persistent thorn in Huntingdon's side, bowled Harris, and later had Mike Tacchi caught for 4. Three more run outs secured Huntingdon's fate and their innings closed on 153 for 8. Waresley spokesman John Gillett was cock-a-hoop after the match. "It was a tremendous win for us. We could never have dreamed of winning the Gifford Cup at the start of the season," he beamed.

Waresley capped an excellent 1983 season by finishing runners up in the Millman League. The Gifford Cup victory was the first major trophy won by the side since 1963 and heralded the most successful period in the club's history with 8 further trophies and 4 league titles being achieved in the next 20 years.

## Ist vs Eaton Socon - Nicholson roars to success

In the absence of injured skipper, Cole, Russell Nicholson was called up again for a dream return to Eaton Socon, the club he so faithfully served for many years before coming to Waresley via Papworth.

It was a day Nicholson was very keen not to end in disaster. However, the Waresley batting started with disaster as Blows and Asque became golden duck twins on the 7th and 8th balls of the game!

Then, after Winn fell for a belligerent 31, Masdin and Jay Szwajbak came together for a third consecutive half century partnership. Masdin had no chance this week when, going back to cut, the ball hit somewhere near the

base of the stump having got up no more than three inches!

Australian import Myles Cordeux began probably his best match of the season so far with a hard hitting 24 including 2 sweetly timed sixes. His innings was only ended by an ill-judged, ugly swipe to leg that missed the ball by a good country mile - the result... bowled.

Good scampering from an improved middle order especially by Dan Szwajbak and Boshier, who hit a mighty slap over mid off for six took the score up to 196 before Nicholson got a rather odd LBW decision!

With a new tactic of using the old ball to give Jay Szwajbak a

better chance of turning the ball, Whitfield and Asque found it hard to penetrate the opening pair.

Cordeux continued his excellent day by making the breakthrough and ended with 3 wickets, Boshier tucked in to 2 wickets and Jay Szwajbak became one of Michelle Pfeiffer's two lovers for June.

In the midst of the excitement Masdin dropped two catches and when asked for a quote he said "both very tricky and most mortals wouldn't have got a hand to them".

When Szwajbak took the last wicket much celebration ensued. Begrudging handshakes from the

## June Colts Report

The Colts teams continue to excel right through the youth set-up. We lost 2 Monday coaching sessions to the weather, but have still had excellent attendances on those days that were possible.

**Under 15's** - They have been very unfortunate to have only played 2 matches so far this season for a variety of reasons. Their 1 match in June brought a victory against Buckden, where they chased down 92 scrambling the win with a ball to spare. Nik Patel top scored with 34 runs.

**Under 13's** - This team have continued their winning streak with 3 more victories, and stand on the brink of winning the regional league. They are top of the

## 2nds vs Wisbech II

Then Gillett and Keys put on 73 before Gillett went for 30 (Evans having done all his running!) and Keys for 44. Bourne for Wisbech finished with 4-11 from 9 overs. Waresley were bowled out for 133 to lose by 79 runs.
