## Ists vs Fordham - The Mighty Bosh Destroys Fordham

On an overcast day it didn't look as though much cricket would be played in Cambridgeshire. With early news of Foxton, Khalsa, Yaxley and NCI guaranteed promotion was earned without a ball being bowled.

With Kevin Cole sitting in Steve Warman's car it was left to Phil Masdin to step up to the plate for the toss. With the toss promptly lost Waresley were stuck in to bat on a pudding of a pitch neither team fancied batting on.

Despite some early sticky moments Vince Winn and, in particular, Chris Whitfield got the innings off to an excellent start. Whitfield has now occupied virtually every batting position between 2 and 9 this season and despite looking at home in all of them, hopefully he will find a settled niche in the Tucker I

batting line up next year. After Winn and Whitfield were both clean bowled the reliable run machines of Jay Sz wajbak and Phil Masdin came to the wicket. Once again they didn't disappoint with yet another 50 plus partnership.

With Sz wajbak again falling to a dolly drop spinner Simon Blows came in and hit a rapid 30 and with Steve Warman, Chris Asque and Dan Sz wajbak adding a few at the end Waresley reached an excellent looking 192 for 6. A target which was worth nearly half as much again on a slow track and even slower outfield.

Waresley took the field again looking for leading wicket takers Nigel Buckingham-Jones and Chris Whitfield to do the damage but things were to take a slightly different and remarkable turn.

Recognising that the old ball would be hard to hit, captaincy genius, Kevin Cole opened the bowling with Laurence Boshier and B-J and kept the old ball. It was clear from the first over that this was going to be special day for Boshier. He clean bowled the Fordham opener with a good leg stump yorker. In the next over he had his next victim LBW. He then bowled a real mix of great wicket taking balls and absolute pies... the pies were then hit straight to B-J's hands for more wickets.

B-J, meanwhile, was bowling as tight as usual with 9 overs for 5 runs, which was just as well as Boshier was going for hatfuls! Whitfield was called upon briefly for 2 overs but it wasn't to be his wicket with Jay Sz wajbak quickly taking over and then taking the 7th wicket to deprive Boshier of a Lakeresque all ten.

Jay Sz wajbak hit 57 then retired hurt with a shoulder injury... poor lamb! That should keep him at the top of the averages with Masdin prepared to lose his wicket (as usual) and this time for 38. Both players have had fine seasons with Sz wajbak taking top honours in the batting de-

partment.

Waresley's 196 for 7 looked good on a damp pitch and despite an opening stand of 46 Socon never really looked in for the fight. The local rivalry was only ever going one way. Eaton collapsed against some fine bowling from Chris Asque who finished on season best figures of 6 for 31 and was twice on a hat-trick but failed to convert either.

With 25 points in the bag all attention turned to what was

going on in Cambridge with the Foxton - NCI game. Anything less than a win would give the league to Waresley.

Unfortunately an NCI collapse robbed Waresley of the league but a fine overall season's performance gave the club second place and very well-earned promotion to Tucker Division I.

## Looking Back – 15 Years Ago

Moving forward 115 years from last issue to 1993, we find Waresley starting out on their annual tour of the Cotswolds. These tours, organised by Chris & Alan Walker, using their local connections in the Forage business, began in 1986 & involved a squad of between 12 to 16 players and friends being carted in the back of a hay truck, usually to the Lygon Arms in Chipping Campden, Gloucestershire, for three days of Cricket, drinking and other high-spirited goings-on. After a number of beverages on the way down, the first game began at 4.30pm – a 30 over match at Stratford-upon-Avon against the Farmers Insurance Sports & Social Club (FISSC) CC – a successful Cotswold Hills League team. Waresley won the toss and batted – mainly to give the bowlers & fielders time

to sober-up. Vince Winn succumbed early on & Steve Slater staggered to the crease to join a swaying Adie Dean. After four overs, the score had crawled to 3 for 1 and it looked as though the effects of the 'journey' would take some time to wear off. Gradually, the runs started to flow more freely and by the time Dean was out for 45 in the 19<sup>th</sup> over, the score had advanced to 124-2. Chris Walker then joined the fray which was the signal for Slater to go 'ballistic' - the next 9 overs saw 119 runs scored with Walker's share just 13. Boundaries were cut, pulled & hoicked all over the ground as Slater hit 18 fours and 11 sixes and took one poor bowler for 30 off his only over. When he finally holed-out in the 28<sup>th</sup> over, he had hit a then club record score of 178 (this was equalled by James Collings in 1999 until being

beaten by Simon Blows' double century in 2001). Walker followed the next ball and it was left to Adrian White & Phil Gillett to take the total to a massive 261 for 4 off the allotted 30 overs. FISSC never had a chance of making a game of it after that but finished with a creditable 156 for 8, the wickets being shared between Rod Kerr (3), Vince Winn (2) and one each for Andy Brookman & Phil Gillett.

Over the remainder of the tour, Waresley lost a 55 over game to Moreton-in-Marsh by 19 runs and went down by 2 wickets to Tony Slatter's XI at Shipston-on-Stour, despite posting 236 for 7. Tours were ar-

ranged sporadically in the following decade including two more to the Cotswolds, one to North Devon and another to the Isle of Wight – perhaps it is time to revive this tradition? In 1993,

Steve Slater carried on his amazing form with both bat & ball, becoming the only Waresley player ever to achieve the 'double' of 1000 runs & 100 wickets in a season.

## President's Game 2008

With the scores level and with two wickets in hand, White pro-

duced two magical deliveries to clean bowl Terry Hayden and trap Peter Colebrook LBW, so it ended in a tie. Thanks to president Michael Banks for his hospitality and for providing such superb weather!

## 2nd XI vs Buckden

Waresley 2nd XI's final league game ended in a resounding 8 wicket victory, but the result only told half the story. The week leading up to the game had seen much soul searching for Skipper Jim Keys, who for almost the first time in 3 seasons was faced with a selection crisis, too many players.

So the eleven players who took the field (which incidentally did not include Keys who selflessly dropped himself) were under no illusions that only their best would do.

Having won the toss, and with the day threatening rain later, Waresley decided to field first.

Opening bowlers Hayden and Gillett made good use of the new ball, and it wasn't long before Hayden struck the first blow. A short delivery top edged by Shorey and Greenfield taking a difficult catch over his shoulder running backwards from first slip.

Hayden picked up his second, clean bowling Pepper for a duck and with Gillett bowling his customary miserly spell from the other end it was going to take a real gritty batting display from someone if Buckden were going to reach any kind of score. So step up to the plate Paul Tidey. The fact Paul was playing at all speaks volumes, as earlier in the season he had endured a life threatening illness. Each ball from Gillett was met by Tidey with a dead bat and a customary shake of the head followed by a cursory look at the wicket. Unfortunately the batsmen at the other end were not showing the same resolve. Cox offered a simple caught and bowled to Gillett and Mews soon followed to give Gillett some reward for his efforts, but the wicket of Tidey was the one Gillett really wanted. So when he got a ball to lift from just short of a length and Tidey fended it towards the waiting hands of gully Gillett was

already celebrating. Unfortunately the waiting hands at gully belonged to Jamie (F\*\*\* it) Fensome and the chance was gone much to Gillett's annoyance.

Hayden (2-14) was replaced by Ellerbeck from the pavilion end and Gillett (2 for 10 from 11 overs) made way for Reddy from the bottom. Despite Ellerbeck picking up a quick wicket the game started to drift slightly and although runs were not flowing Waresley needed wickets with rain clouds gathering. Cometh the hour cometh the man and this season that man has been Pete Colebrook, and again he did not disappoint. Batsmen just do not seem to be able to resist his well flighted bowling and it was not long before the trap was snapping shut on another victim. With the momentum restored Reddy (2-20) & Colebrook (2-10) soon mopped up the tail, with Tidey (36) last man out.

Chasing only 66 may not sound to daunting, but Waresley needed to bat positively to avoid getting bogged down on what was still a tricky wicket to bat on. Openers Ian Hayden (25 n.o) and Jamie Fensome (25) did just that. If the ball was there to be hit then they did just that, although not always in the direction they intended, and Waresley were well within sight of the target when Fensome was out. That bought to the wicket Myles Cordeaux, who was making his final competitive appearance for Waresley before returning to Australia, with the chance of hitting the winning runs. So with the rain starting to come down heavily he dispatched the ball swiftly to the boundary a couple of times to send Waresley past the required total, and to the convincing victory that Keys had demanded.

## 2nd XI 2008 Season Review

After having used 33 and 36 different players for the 2nds in the previous 2 seasons, it seemed similar selection problems were happening again when Andy Donald stepped in at the 11<sup>th</sup> hour in the first 2 games.

Having lost the first 5 matches last season we were keen to start better this time, but lost the first away at Wisbech. Pat Ellerbeck took 5-49. Ben Evans top scored with 34.

We then went onto win the next 4 matches:

Houghton & Wyton away – Greenfield 51 (in an 85 opening stand with Simon Donald) and Collings 5-23 plus the return of Adie Dean 3-1 in 3 overs (his second longest spell of the season!)

A remarkable game at home to Warboys saw Nick Greenfield take 5 catches, which for an outfielder in one match is amazing (and it was 5 out of 5 attempts). Keys took 6-32, 2 catches and 43 not out in an undefeated stand of 74 for the 8<sup>th</sup> wicket with Russ Nicholson.

Buckden away saw Gillett take 3-8 off 12 overs. Keys and Gillett put on 30 for 7<sup>th</sup> wicket to squeeze home in a tight one.

Greenfield back in charge for the

visit of the undefeated Perkins – thrashed by 10 wickets thanks mainly to Collings 69 not out and 4-29 and Donald's third consecutive score in the mid 30s.

Back to earth with a bang in an uneventful game at Nassington where we bowled ok, fielded well, but never looked like win-

ning with 2 terrible run outs in the first 3 wickets, and never recovered. Gillett top scored with 42; mind you he didn't have much to beat as the next highest scorer was Nicholson with an undefeated 16.

Godmanchester at home saw us play at Eltisley – and worried that we might pop to Mrs Donald's house for tea, she decided to kindly "volunteer" for tea duty! Close, topsy-turvy game saw us squeak home by 5 runs. Keys 4-38, Collings 47. Hayden T made his first appearance for the seconds with 3-20.

Ufford Park at home – a side who'd won their last three and proved too strong for another poor batting performance. On an excellent deck at home we were 139-9 at close after being 73 for 7. Gillett and Nicholson added 54 for the 8<sup>th</sup> wicket. Gillett finished with 44 not out and 3-25 taking all 3 Ufford wickets.

Due to the weather we avoided the long trip to Old Eastonians; in the most Westerly part of "Huntingdonshire", apparently!!

Wisbech did the double over us winning by 79 runs with Waresley again succumbing all too easily for 133 on a good track at home. The fielding summed up Waresley's inconsistency this season: Ellerbeck three top diving stops and a dropped catch; James Collings two good catches and another one dropped, and they weren't alone as difficult chances were dropped by Keys, Evans, Gillett and Colebrook. And the batting pretty much did the same 24-5 from 13 overs; only Donald showing any resistance with 11. Then Gillett and Keys put on 73 before Gillett went for 30 and Keys for 44. Keys also took 3-41 from 12 overs.

Houghton & Wyton at home saw the return of Ben Hanglin, and what a return. He made a quick 22 batting at number 10, and then took 4-27 including 3 perfect top of off stump deliveries at real pace in the first 2 overs. Houghton never recovered from 4-3 and despite 3 wickets each
