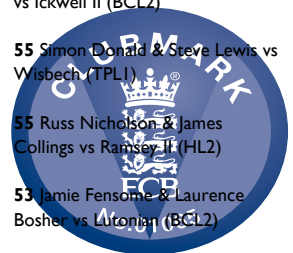

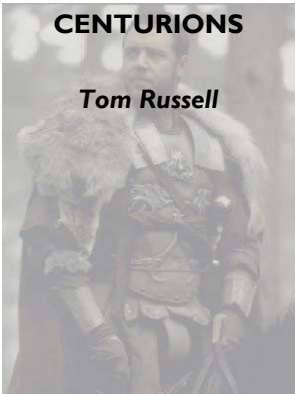

1st XI vs Godmanchester II - 6 June

But a quality team still went to Godmanchester with a recalled Steve Warman in for Jay and Simon Blows rolling back the years (in more ways than one - but more of that later) by resuming his wicket-keeping role given up to Russell Nicholson in the dim and distant past.

After recent heavy rain the pitch resembled a lowland bog and neither team were keen to bat but Godmanchester had first go.

Shortly after Asque got a plumb decision from the umpire and then took the edge of the Goddie number 4 to leave the home side teetering at 33 for 3. Then West and Comer batted strongly to take the score to 81 before further loss. Chris Whitfield started slow

before a pep talk from Terry Hayden seemed to spark him to bowling faster and more aggressively. What Terry said is a trade secret but let's face it - he'd anger most of us!!

Cafferkey came in following a sharp catch by Blows reeling in the years behind the stumps off

Nigel Buckingham-Jones.

Buckingham-Jones was again bowling well ending up with the 1st XI's first five wicket haul of the season.

In the 43rd over Blows again turned the clock back by innocuously tearing a calf muscle and having to limp off maintaining a fine and consistent injury record. John Gillett, perhaps somewhat unkindly, suggested

retirement to concentrate on this newsletter! Whitfield took over behind the stumps showing that he can bat, bowl, take three catches and also keep wicket!

Godmanchester were bowled out quickly with fine death bowling from Chris Asque and Buckingham-Jones with the last 6 wickets for 23 runs.

An opening stand of 28 between Chris Asque and Simon Donald, whilst not setting the world alight was a solid enough start. Asque in particular looking fluent.

Masdin fell victim to a ball that stopped and chipped one tamely to mid off for a swim in the duckpond. Only Steve Lewis, firstly with the battling Donald and then with the ebullient Chris Whitfield, playing some fine attacking cricket.

Once Steve Lewis was out though it was a sorry parade of low scores as one by one Cole, Blows (with Asque speeding him up considerably as a runner), Buckingham-Jones and finally

2nd XI vs Godmanchester III - 6 June

This month, we go back 20 years to the big Millman 2nd XI derby game against Potton at the Hollow.

The omens were not good for the visitors who had lost all of their games by large margins so far and were only able to muster ten players for this encounter – skipper Ian Keeves was absent. The side was made up of Ian Feather, Nick Greenfield, Wally Kuhne, Pat Smith, Peter Tebbs, Steve Greenfield, Nick Lenton, Dean Smith & Steve Baker.

Waresley won the toss and bravely decided to bat first. Veteran of nearly 30 years experience Feather and 19 year old Nick Greenfield opened the innings and got the match off to a steady if unspectacular start – surviving the first 10 overs and putting 38 on the board. The next 10 overs saw the pair add a further 54 and at the thirty over stage they were still together

having taken their partnership to 131. Greenfield reached his maiden century in the 39th over and finally departed in the 41st,

being bowled by Tom Miles for a fine 102 including 13 fours. The pair had posted a then record opening stand of 175 – Wally Kuhne joined Feather for the last few overs, taking the final total up to 188 for 1 off 45. Feather carried his bat for 68 with 8 fours.

The home side needed to score at just above four an over and soon started to lose wickets to the accurate Waresley attack. Nick Lenton & Gareth Thomas reduced them to 80 for 6 until Brian Steele was joined at the crease by Tom Miles who steadied the ship and added a priceless 71 for the 7th wicket. Steele was then bowled by Lenton for 66, followed soon after by Miles who made a stubborn 24.

The Potton tail continued to wag as they edged ever closer to their target but they could not overcome the Welsh guile of Thomas who, along with Wally Kuhne restricted the innings to 176-9 at the end of

the 45th over, 12 runs shy of Waresley's score. Thomas finished with 5-42 & Lenton 4-40.

Other than that, 1989 was a poor year for Waresley 2nds who only managed one more win that season against Cople. Of the players, Nick Greenfield has enjoyed a successful career with both 1st & 2nd XI and is still a vital member of the squad. Nick Lenton now plays for Hatley, Gareth Thomas is a fully qualified Umpire who raises large sums of money for the club through ball sponsorship. Wally Kuhne moved away from the area and sadly, Ian Feather passed away in 2005 after a long illness at the age of just 63 – his ashes were scattered on the

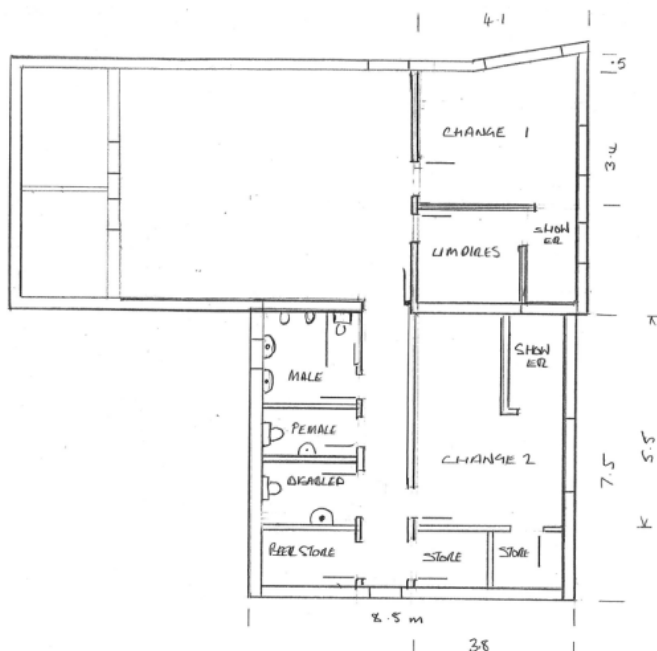
isting home changing room would then become the umpires changing room.

Ickwell also made a reasonable start as skipper Darren Williams (32) and Bruce Kilby (36) put together an opening stand of 60.

Although most of the later batsmen got into double figures, no-one got established and at 162 - 7 with 10 overs and another 66 runs required it looked as if Ickwell were set for a defeat. But Jak Winder (30) and Paul Lewis (36*) came to the rescue and got Ickwell closer to the required total. With 4 overs to go and 22 runs were needed with only one wicket remaining. But they had a lucky break as the ball hit the stumps but failed
