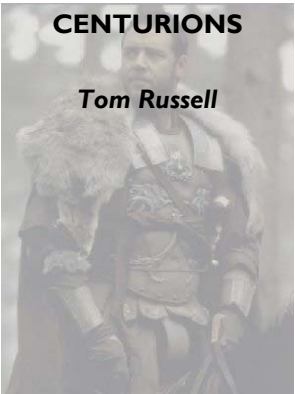

Waresley needed a big innings from one of their top order but it was not to be as Bowen took two quick wickets with only young Simon Donald emerging with any credit with a fine 21.
